What is the Vision 20 Breakout?

- When NAPPC began we had [a 20-year plan](#) and proudly, we have accomplished most of our initial goals. Now after 20 years, we would like to revisit our priorities with your help.
- This breakout session taking place on Thursday, 10/20, aims to bring together all NAPPC participants and member organizations to reimagine big picture ideas for the prosperity of pollinator health in the long term.
- This doesn't necessarily mean that NAPPC must accomplish these activities, but rather, aims to identify priorities that inform all of our work going forward toward a common goal.

Discussion Prompts

- Consider what NAPPC's original mission and goals were and what this collaborative has accomplished over the past 20 years.
- Think BIG: The sky's the limit here. Try to put obstacles aside and think ideally about what you would like to see accomplished for pollinators.
- Think Long-Term: Science, landscape change, and community shifts take time, so think broadly within the next 20 years.

Instructions

- As a group (assigned at random), complete the worksheet on the following page of this document. Allow the Steering Committee members to provide background and lead the discussion.
- A P2 Staff member will take notes on this shared google docs sheet and submit it to conference facilitators at the end of the hour.
- Start with a group understanding of the Vision. The group may make edits to this vision.
- Work off of the sample Vision provided to brainstorm and capture existing issues and future activities that the group deems critical to be achieved in the next 20 years. You do not need to complete 5 issues/actions, however you may add more than 5 if desired.
 - For example: widespread tracking of pesticide use, taxonomic and identification improvements, etc.
- Issues/Actions may be identified by country (Canada, United States, and Mexico) or they may involve all of North America.
