	NATIVE PLANT NAME	HEIGHT/HABIT	UNIQUE QUALITIES
1	Aromatic aster (Symphyotri- chum (Aster) oblongifolium)	2 Feet	Lavender-flowering in fall
2	Ladies eardrops (Brunichia ovata)	Woody vine	Attracts large numbers of bees
3	Marsh milkweed (Asclepias incarnata)	4–5 Feet	Attracts butterflies, beetles, and bees
4	Eastern blazingstar (<i>Liatris scariosa</i>)	3–4 Feet	Attracts butterflies
5	Robin's plaintain (Erigeron pulchellus)	3–5 Inches/ Groundcover	Attracts digger bees
6	Slender mountain mint (Pycnanthemum tenuifolium)	1–2 Feet	Attracts bees, wasps, butterflies
7	Foxglove beardtongue (Penstemon digitalis)	2–3 Feet	Attracts bumble bees
8	Wild bergamot (Monarda fistulosa)	3–4 Feet	Attracts bees, hummingbird moths, butterflies
9	Wild hydrangea (Hydrangea arborescens)	3–5 Feet/Shrub	Attracts bees, butterflies, wasps
10	Cliff goldenrod (Solidago drummondii)	2 Feet/ Mounding	Attracts bees, beetles, butterflies
