WHEREAS, pollinators provide significant ecosystem benefits that are essential to maintaining the diversity of our native flowering plants; and

WHEREAS, pollinators play a vital role in the health of our national forests and grasslands, which provide forage, fish, wildlife, timber, water, mineral resources, and recreational opportunities, in addition to enhanced economic development opportunities for communities; and

WHEREAS, Colorado has a high diversity of native bees that, in partnership with honey bees and beekeepers, are highly efficient pollinators of our flowers, vegetables, and fruits; and

WHEREAS, pollinator populations are in decline and require a comprehensive approach to providing healthy diverse habitat in the state, and raising public awareness is key to protecting pollinators; and

WHEREAS, Coloradans support conservation measures that promote the protection and maintenance of pollinator habitats;
