

By His Excellency Dannel P. Malloy, Governor: an

Official Statement

OW HEREAS, pollinator species, including birds, mammals, and insects, are essential partners of farmers and ranchers in producing much of our food supply; and

MEREAS, pollination plays a vital role in the health of our national forests and grasslands, which provide forage, fish and wildlife, timber, water, mineral resources, and recreational opportunities in addition to enhanced economic development opportunities for communities; and

OW HEREAS, pollinator species provide significant environmental benefits that are necessary for maintaining healthy, bio-diverse ecosystems; and

WHEREAS, the State of Connecticut is home to at least 326 documented species of wild bees in addition to the domesticated honey bee; and

MEREAS, the State of Connecticut provides assistance to beekeepers throughout the state through the work of the State Apiary Inspector, as well as providing research on both domesticated honey bees and wild bees at the Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station and the University of Connecticut; and

OW HEREAS, the State of Connecticut has managed wildlife habitats and public lands, such as State forests and grasslands, for decades; and

MHEREAS, the State of Connecticut provides producers with conservation assistance to promote wise conservation stewardship, including the protection and maintenance of pollinators and their habitats on working lands and wild lands; now
